By subleasing from another association, we are recognizing significant savings. The budget will thank us!



Threshold for additional assessment and control measures

California's New Indoor Heat Illness Regulation is Effective as of July 23, 2024

In California, employers must now take steps to protect workers from heat illness in both indoor and outdoor

workplaces under California Code of Regulations, Title 8 (T8CCR), sections 3395 (outdoor) and 3396 (indoor). The "Heat Illness Prevention in Indoor Places of Employment" standard applies to most workplaces where the indoor temperature reaches 82°F. This standard went into effect on July 23, 2024.

Many of the indoor regulation requirements mirror those of the outdoor regulation -- so much so that Cal/OSHA provides a *combined* model plan for employers to use (see Resources below). Both require:

- a written plan,
- training of impacted workers,
- administrative and engineering controls,
- provision of water and access to cool-down areas,
- acclimatization, and
- emergency response procedures.

Cal/OSHA can now begin indoor heat illness inspections based on the new regulation. So, take advantage of the Resources below and upcoming Training to make sure your business is in compliance.
